UPDATE FROM MS. JAMES and MR. ARREDONDO

- All Lyndale families should have received the MPS Application for Educational Benefits/Free or Reduced Price Meals form in the mail. The school receives Title 1 funds based on how many of these forms are returned, regardless of how many are interested in or eligible for the programs. PLEASE COMPLETE AND SUBMIT THIS FORM. Title 1 funds support many programs at Lyndale. You may simply write 'not interested' instead of filling in personal information. There are extra forms in the office.
- The Lyndale Student/Family handbook has been updated and will be sent home with students shortly.
- Lyndale has the opportunity to host an after-school violin class, El Sistema, for 24 1st graders. Taught by musicians with the Minnesota Orchestra, students will learn how violins are made and be provided one to learn with. The cost of the program is \$8000 but will be offered free to students. It would be offered to 1st graders only this academic year, the selection process has not yet been

determined; 4 days per week; 3:10-4:45P (Monday-Thursday).

- As of September 11 Lyndale is slightly below capacity in every grade. Classroom enrollment is at or below district average in every grade.

- RT Rybak, the previous mayor of Minneapolis and the current Executive Director of Generation Next, has asked if Lyndale would consider being a pilot school for the program. - The Pleasant Pathways program will be starting at the end of September and running until the weather gets too cold. This has the school buses drop kids off four blocks from school (on 38th and Pleasant) where they are met by teachers and staff that walk the rest of the way with them.

WEIGHTED STUDENT FUNDING (WSF)

Minneapolis Public Schools is considering a change in how funding is distributed to schools. Weighted Student Funding (WSF) is a way of "...differentiating funding to schools based on specific student needs and aligning funding with strategic priorities." If the district changes to this format Lyndale's funding could be increased. Parents from other schools have been very vocal in their opposition. If families are supportive of this new program they should make their voices heard. The best place to do this is the Area C Parent Advisory Council Meetings. The next one will be held

PLAYGROUND UPDATES

Lyndale will be installing 4 picnic tables on the playground near the purple benches. Each table seats 8 kids which allows for an outside learning space. This led to a discussion about adding some trees for shade. PTO President Carrie Swanson had reached out to the Park Board about trees, but because the land belongs to the school, it is out of their jurisdiction. (They only manage the wading pool.) The Tree Trust program was suggested as an option to look into and one attendee has a relative in the tree industry and will look for possible resources there.

On a less happy note, a Lyndale student found an item of drug paraphernalia on the playground. While the school monitors the playground very closely during the day, there is little that can be done to watch it overnight. Suggestions responding to this included asking the Lyndale Community Walk Patrol to add the playground to their route, asking the police for more frequent drive-bys, and asking neighbors to call police when they see anything suspicious.

BIKES UNDER THE STAIRS

A parent asked why there are bikes under one of the stairwells. A few years ago the school purchased 12 bikes for an afterschool bike-riding program that taught kids bike maintenance and safety. Unfortunately the staff who ran it are no longer able to. If YOU would be interested, please contact Ms. James.

The Lyndale PTO has always been an active organization that was managed casually.
